Summary Report to the NCCA Board for Meeting June 11, 2021

HB 415

Has passed the House unanimously. Sits in the Senate Rules Committee.

Technology and Renewal Process

In preparation for license renewals, we are undergoing technology upgrades that should make license renewals more efficient for users and less stressful for staff. Upgrades include the move to CE Broker, web site upgrades, and system automations

CCA Level I and Level II Rule Revision

This change will:

- Create just one program for Certified Chiropractic Assistants
The program will have two levels:
 - CCA Level I Clinical
 - CCA Level II X-ray
- Change the renewal term to 2 years for all certifications (Levels I and II)
- Change the renewal date to June 30 for all certifications
- Change the CE requirement for Level II - 6 hours Level I CE plus 6 hours Level II (X-ray) CE every 2 yrs
- CCA Level I CE requirement will be 6 hours for each 2 year renewal

Discipline

We continue to investigate complaints against chiropractic physicians. Where appropriate, we initiate the complaint process and hold hearings as indicated. Both chiropractic physicians and members of the public are able to file complaints with this board.
